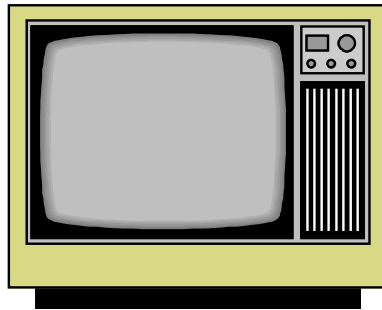


## Paying for your TV Licence



If a person uses a television set or other such equipment without a T.V. Licence they run the risk of being fined.

A person cannot be imprisoned for not having a T.V. Licence; however they could be imprisoned for non-payment of the resulting fine.

Buying a T.V. Licence outright is out of question for a lot of people. Other options include:

- Debit\Credit card – call 0300 790 6063, accepts from a wide range of debit cards including Maestro/Switch and Delta.
- Direct Debit - if the person has a bank account - these can be monthly, quarterly or annual payments – call 0300 790 6063.
- Payment Card – spread the cost of your colour TV licence in weekly or monthly payments from as little as £5.60 per week – apply for your payment card 0300 555 0286.
- Savings Card – if you already have a TV licence, this offers a simple way to save for you're your next licence. You can deposit savings whenever you like, with a minimum payment of £2 – apply now by calling 0300 555 0281
- Over-the-counter – Make payments in person – call 0300 555 0300. Visit [www.paypoint.co.uk/locator](http://www.paypoint.co.uk/locator) to find your nearest outlet.
- By Post – send a cheque made payable to TV licensing to ;
